### Frushi Recipe from the Fete

- 1 cup sushi rice
- 1 1/4 cups water
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1/4 cup lite coconut milk
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- Shredded coconut, toasted (optional)
- Thinly sliced fruit (mango, kiwi, strawberry, plum and nectarine work well)

#### Method:

Rinse rice until water runs clear and soak in cold water for 30 minutes. Drain rice and bring to boil in a saucepan with 1 1/4 cups of water. Reduce heat to low and cover. Cook for 10-15 mins until water is almost absorbed and then take off the heat and leave covered for 15 minutes. Mix sugar, salt and coconut milk into rice and leave to cool. Shape into bite size 'sushi' pieces using a tablespoon or mold. Roll in coconut to coat sides and refrigerate. When cold, top with sliced fruit and enjoy!
