Dear Parents

This term we welcomed back the Howarth family who have been on an overseas posting. It is wonderful to be able to accommodate our families and ensure a smooth transition so that the children can reconnect with friends. During the week we also welcomed Mr Angus Tulley, Deputy Director, Catholic Education for a visit to our school and to engage with the children and meet the teachers over lunch.

I feel it is timely to remind parents and cares of several of our school protocols -

Lollies and Birthday Treats - In line with the St Monica's healthy food policy we ask that parents **avoid sending in lolly bags as a classroom birthday treat**. The key reason for this initiative introduced midway through 2015 was that on occasions teachers were distributing up to three bags of lolly bags per child as birthday treats. While the teachers asked the children to take the lollies home, the temptation was often just too much for the younger children to resist. As parents you select what your child brings to school for morning tea and lunch; at school it is our responsibility to care for all children and monitor that they do not share or eat foods that may have an adverse effect.

Uniform - There is an expectation of all parents of children attending Catholic schools that their child wear a uniform. This is viewed as most important at St Monica's. Children not in full uniform should have a written explanation from parents when this occurs. All clothing should be clearly labelled with your child's name with a permanent marker. This is suggested because markings with other than wash-proof pens wear off and the subsequent loss of clothing is expensive. Boys should be wearing long navy pants as part of their winter uniform and black leather shoes.

Parking - Please park in designated carparks and avoid the staff carpark as it is a thoroughfare for children moving between the school and hall.

School Attendance - Children must be encouraged to attend school daily. It is a legal requirement that all absences from school be explained. If your child is going to be away please notify the school by phone, email or the link on our school App. Teachers are required to raise issues of poor attendance with the Principal. Where an acceptable response is not received the school is obligated to contact the authorities. Every effort is made, by the school staff, to ensure regular attendance is maintained.

It can be very distracting for your child and the class if they arrive late. It is sometimes unavoidable but please make every effort to arrive on time. All children arriving after the bell, collected during the day for an appointment or picked up early must be signed in or out in the school register. The register is found on the counter at the front office.

Leave 10 - 100 Days - Family holidays and travel are no longer considered under the Exemption from School Procedures. Travel outside of the vacation period is counted as an absence for statistical purposes. Application for Extended Leave form (available from Front Office) must be completed when a child/ren will be away travelling with family for 10 or more days.

not be published. As we respect your choice the teachers are currently updating their lists based on permissions provided in 2017 or current enrolment forms. Should you wish to change your preference or confirm your choice please speak to your child's teacher.




Touch Typing Program




Support Staff Day - Monday 13 August 2018
